Creekmouth (Animation, Documentary), Dir: Yasmine Djedje-Fisher-Azoume, 4:43

An animation and oral histories project documenting the loss of Creekmouth Village in the 1953 flood.

Milk (Documentary), Dir: Miranda Stern, 26:51

A filmmaker sets out on a journey to discover the mother she never knew. Like the ancient Japanese art of kintsugi, the act of piecing back together all the scattered, jagged, and broken bits of her mother's life somehow helps her make sense of her own life, but like the act of filmmaking itself, it is a journey that will never feel complete.







Scala Rising: Anarchic Shorts from London's Legendary Underground Cinema

Das Londoner Scala Cinema (1978–1993) zog während der repressiven Thatcher-Jahre mit einem wilden Mix aus Kult- und Arthouse-Filmen, queeren Themen und endlosen Filmnächten ein breites Publikum von selbsternannten Außenseiter*innen und Sonderlingen an. 
